At the close of the 2018/2019 Season we bid farewell to Music Director, Steven Smith. Over the nine seasons of his tenure, Steven raised the Richmond Symphony to new heights of artistic excellence and took the Symphony into new venues to reach a wider, more diverse audience. During our current season five outstanding candidates will take their turn at the podium and one will become our new music director.

WE SHARED GREAT MUSIC...

- Five sold out concerts in the 2018/2019 season, including the Opening Night performance with renowned pianist, Lang Lang.
- Summer Series 2018, "The World of Robert Schumann," **sold out** every concert.
- **350+ tickets** were provided to active members of the military with support from Dominion Energy.
- 100 members joined the new **20/30 Group** for music lovers ages 21-39.
- New audiences met the Richmond Symphony when we performed with "Weird AI" Yankovic at RIR.
- A special **"Centennial of the Armistice 1918"** concert was held in collaboration with the Virginia WWI and WWII Commission.




