Menuhin Competition Richmond 2020 passes the \$2M mark in fundraising -The 44 international competitors to be announced soon!

Richmond, Va. (Dec. 20, 2019) — The Menuhin Competition Richmond 2020, the 'Olympics of the Violin', is pleased and grateful to announce that fundraising for the project has just surpassed the \$2 million mark in cash and pledges, and is approaching its \$2.5 million goal to cover the costs of hosting the prestigious international event.

"We are thrilled that Richmond 2020 has garnered broad community participation and support. We hope that all the region will embrace the Competition and take part in this international celebration of youth and music as audience members, volunteers, patrons and cheerleaders, for all eleven days next May. We continue to seek ways to involve as many community members as possible, as the eyes of the world will be on the City," said David Fisk, executive director of the Richmond Symphony.

To date, Richmond 2020 has attracted 60 community partners and funders. The organization of the Competition is being led by the Richmond Symphony with co-hosts University of Richmond, Virginia Commonwealth University and VPM PBS and NPR, in partnership with the City of Richmond. Often hailed as 'The Olympics of the Violin', the Menuhin Competition and festival has established itself as the world's leading international competition for young violinists. For more than three decades the Competition has established a reputation for fairness and integrity, with each new Competition year accepting hundreds of applicants for 44 coveted spots. Founded in 1983, the Menuhin Competition has served countless aspiring concert violinists as a major catalyst for initiating the trajectory from the very early days of their international solo and orchestral careers into household names. On April 22, 2018, Richmond was announced as the host city for the 2020 Competition.

Named after the famed violinist and conductor Yehudi Menuhin, the eleven-day festival attracts the greatest young violinists under the age of 22 from around the world to compete through recitals, chamber concerts and showcase performances with the Richmond Symphony. Competitors are judged by a jury of some of the world's most celebrated musicians who also perform in recitals and other concerts throughout the festival.

The Competition will take place May 14 - 24, 2020 in venues throughout the city including the Modlin Center for the Arts at University of Richmond, the W.E. Singleton Center for the Performing Arts at VCU and in the Carpenter Theatre at the Dominion Energy Center. Throughout the Competition 44 of the best young violinists in the world will compete for top awards in performances ranging from solo recitals to concerts with chamber groups and full orchestra. While the Richmond Symphony will be the primary accompanying orchestra for the festival, the Sphinx Virtuosi ensemble - made up exclusively of 18 of the nation's top Black and Latinx classical musicians - will also participate in accompanying the Junior Finals and in performances and workshops with local public schools.

In addition to the vast international exposure and unique cultural and learning experience of participating in the most coveted competition offered to young violinists, contestants are offered a variety of invaluable opportunities during the eleven-day

event. They have the chance to interact with fellow competitors as well as the distinguished roster of judges, each of whom lead masterclasses and offer feedback to the violinists regardless of their advancement in the Competition.

About the Menuhin Competition Trust:

The Menuhin Competition is the world's leading international competition for young violinists, held every two years in a different city (most recently in Geneva in 2018, London in 2016, Austin, Texas in 2014, Beijing in 2012 and Oslo in 2010). Founded by Yehudi Menuhin in 1983 the Competition attracts hundreds of entries from over 40 countries, choosing only 44 of the world's very best young violinists to participate. The Competition discovers, encourages and nurtures exceptionally talented young musicians from all corners of the globe under the age of 22 to develop into the next generation of great artists.

As one of Yehudi Menuhin's most valuable legacies, the Competition continues to uphold his status as a cultural ambassador and true world citizen by creating an exceptional family atmosphere of learning and exchange. Collaborative in its spirit, the focus is placed on participation and learning rather than winning the 1st Prize.

Creating a stimulating environment in which talented young violinists may learn and grow has always been and will remain at the heart of the Menuhin Competition. This is not limited to the Competition period and the Menuhin Competition Trust strives to provide prizewinners with a variety of performance opportunities to develop their musical careers.

About the Richmond Symphony (<u>www.richmondsymphony.com</u>):

Kicking off its 62nd Season in September 2019, the Richmond Symphony is the largest performing arts organization in Central Virginia. The organization includes an orchestra of more than 70 professional musicians, the 150-voice Richmond Symphony Chorus and more than 260 students in the Richmond Symphony Youth Orchestra programs. Each season, more than

200,000 members of the community enjoy live concerts and radio broadcasts. The Symphony also provides educational outreach programs to over 55,000 students and teachers each year. The Symphony was recently named one of 21 American orchestras selected as a leader in orchestra innovation by the League of American Orchestras through its Futures Fund Initiative. The Richmond Symphony is partially funded by the Virginia Commission for the Arts and the National Endowment for the Arts.
