# Richmond Symphony Welcomes Fourth Music Director Candidate, Valentina Peleggi

Richmond, Va. (Jan. 30, 2020)—The Richmond Symphony is pleased to host its fourth **Music Director Candidate, Valentina Peleggi,** from March 7-14, 2020. Peleggi will lead a series of Symphony concerts and pre-concert talks in the community, including:

- Altria Masterworks concerts on Sat., March 7 at 8 p.m. and Sun., March 8 at 3 p.m. at Dominion Energy Center, Carpenter Theatre, with Angela Cheng, piano; pre-concert talk with Peleggi at 7 p.m. on Sat. and 2 p.m. on Sun.
- Atlantic Union Bank Lollipops concert on Sat., March 14 at 11 a.m. at Dominion Energy Center, Carpenter Theatre

Peleggi is a current Mackerras Fellow at the English National Opera and guest music director with the Theatro Seo Padro in São Paulo, Brazil, serving previously as resident conductor of the OSESP- São Paulo Symphony Orchestra. She has led orchestras from around the world, including the Royal Philharmonic Orchestra, BBC Orchestra of Wales, Norrkoping Symphony (Norway), Orchestra della Toscana, and Baltimore Symphony Orchestra, among many others. The first Italian woman to enter the conducting program at the Royal Academy of Music in London, Peleggi graduated with distinction and was awarded the DipRAM for her outstanding final concert.

Peleggi is the fourth of five music director candidates leading the Richmond Symphony in the 2019-20 season and being considered to follow former Music Director Steven Smith, who stepped down from the position at the end of last season. The other candidates are Roderick Cox, who appeared with Symphony October 17-27, 2019; Ankush Kumar Bahl, who appeared January 11-18, 2020; Laura Jackson, who will appear Jan. 31-Feb. 9, 2020; and Farkhad Khudyev; who will appear April 18-26, 2020.

#### Richmond Symphony, Peleggi, p. 2

The Richmond Symphony search committee, comprised of symphony musicians and board members, received more than 200 applications before selecting the final five candidates. The committee is considering various criteria for each candidate, including musicianship and commitment to the community, but mutual chemistry between the audience and the orchestra will be paramount, according to David Fisk, executive director of the Richmond Symphony. The announcement of the new music director is expected in May 2020.

Discover Music Director Candidate Valentina Peleggi as she leads the Richmond Symphony in a program giving a nod to her Italian heritage, including Rossini's overture to the opera *La gazza ladra (The Thieving Magpie)*; Respighi's beloved *Pines of Rome*, inspired by the Roman landscape; and Tchaikovsky's *Francesca da Rimini*, Opus 32, a tone poem based on Dante's *Inferno*. The program also celebrates women in music, with pianist Angela Cheng performing Clara Schumann's Piano Concerto in A Minor, Opus 7, celebrating the 200<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the composer's birthday, and Joan Tower's *Fanfare for the Uncommon Woman*, No. 2, dedicated to Aaron Copland and "to women who take risks and are adventurous."
